

# 2006 Foundation Grants

## UNRESTRICTED GENERAL

### IMPACT GRANTS

#### **James F. Pack Teen Center - Boys & Girls Club - Lawrenceville - \$50,000**

The grant monies will accommodate the 1,700 youth that are served at this center through the Power Hour program by supplying each club member with school supplies & power hours, activities and incentives.

#### **GRN Community Service Board - \$50,000**

The grant monies will be used for the community stake holder meetings focusing on crisis stabilization unit training and to purchase recreational and education equipment for the unit.

#### **Gwinnett County Children's Shelter - \$50,000**

The grant monies will provide funding for the Shelter's boys' home which will provide safe, therapeutic and residential shelter services to abused, abandoned, neglected, and runaway boys between the ages of 5 & 17.

#### **Gwinnett Council for the Arts - \$35,000**

The grant monies from the Mary Kistner Endowment Fund will fund the Winslow Homer: Wood Engraving Exhibit that is scheduled to open February 1, 2007 and run through April 30, 2007.

#### **Gwinnett Tech Foundation - \$50,000**

Funding will be used to construct and equip the infant playground for the D. Scott Hudgens, Jr. Early Education Center on the Gwinnett Technical College campus. The Center will accommodate 220 early learners from 6 weeks through Pre-K.

#### **Robert D. Fowler Family YMCA - \$50,000**

\$10,000 will be used to provide after-school enrichment program services for 38 children between the ages of 5 and 12 years of age. The remainder of the monies (\$40,000) will be used for the completion of the Senior Center, which will be opened in April 2007.

#### **Gwinnett Environmental & Heritage Center - \$100,000**

The grant monies from the Mary Kistner Endowment Fund will be used to equipment the "David and Mary Kistner Lab." This lab will be used to promote the preservation of our natural resources in Gwinnett County.

### THE SCOTT HUDGENS SCHOLARSHIP FUND

He contributed millions to his beloved community with a cheerful and unselfish heart. One of Scott's visions was to provide scholarships for "C" students. This fund affords college tuition to graduates who, though not necessarily identified as academic or athletic leaders in their senior classes, still possess the skill to be academically successful in college. The endowment provides annual college scholarships for Duluth High School graduating seniors.



### JOHN, LYNNE & NICOLE BELLI MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Roy and Sarah Belli established the "John, Lynne and Nicole Belli Memorial Scholarship Fund" in memory of their son, daughter-in-law and granddaughter who were lost in a tragic accident in 2003. The scholarship will provide tuition assistance for Gwinnett County seniors who wish to further their education at the collegiate level but lack the necessary funding. As a permanent endowment, the fund will benefit our community in perpetuity by awarding scholarship grants annually from income to deserving students in the name of these cherished family members.
